

# **Register and Vote in Monroe County**

### **Primary Election**

### You have the right to vote in Indiana if you . . .

- 1. Are a U.S. citizen and a resident of Indiana.
- 2. Are at least 18 years old on or before the next general or municipal election.
- 3. Are currently not in prison after being convicted of a crime.
- 4. Have lived in your current precinct for at least 30 days prior to the election. (If you have moved within 30 days of the election, vote at your former precinct, either inperson or by mail.)
- 5. Are registered to vote.

You may <u>register</u> online, in person, or by mail.

Registration must be received at Monroe County Election Central
by April 3 for the Primary Election.

To register online, you will need a valid Indiana:

- Driver's license /or/
- Bureau of Motor Vehicles ID card.

- 1. Select "Apply online and print forms."
- Select "VRG-7: Voter Registration Application."
- 3. Registration form must be received at Monroe County Election Central by April 3 (October 10 for general election).
- 4. No ID is required to register by mail.

#### You may vote during "early voting," on Election Day, or by mail.

### Vote early or on Election Day:

- You will need to show a photo ID, issued by the State of Indiana or the federal government. Examples:
  - o Indiana driver's license
  - o Indiana BMV ID
  - Indiana public college or university ID
  - Passport
  - o U.S. military ID

### Vote by mail:

Through Mon. Apr. 3	Voter registration
Thur. Apr. 20 by 11:59 pm	Application for absentee ballots due at Election Central.
Tue. Apr. 4 – Fri. Apr. 28 Weekdays except Fri. Apr. 7	Early voting & drop off absentee ballots at Election Operations (302 S. Walnut).
from 8 am – 6 pm  Sat. Apr. 22 and 29  9 am – 4 pm  Mon. May 1	Note: The voter, members of the voter's family, or a power-of-attorney are the only persons allowed to drop off a ballot. Anyone, other than the voter, who brings in a ballot must confirm their compliance by completing Form ABS-19.
8 am - Noon Mon. May 1 by 12:00 noon	Mailed absentee ballots due at Election Central.
141011. 141dy 1 by 12.00 110011	Absentee ballots can also be dropped off at Poll Site.
Tue. May 2 • 6 am – 6 pm	PRIMARY ELECTION – Vote at poll site.

Voting in person? Take your photo ID to your polling place.
